Ascension Prepares to Serve Hundreds at Annual Pancake Breakfast and Silent Auction

Ascension's 13th Annual "God Bless America" Pancake Breakfast Scheduled for April 14th

There's nothing quite like the smell of sizzling bacon and sausage, the taste of hot pancakes hot off the griddle and a steamy cup of coffee outdoors on a cool spring morning. What makes it even better is when it is alongside hundreds of friends and family from the church and school and the surrounding community.

That's what Ascension will be serving up this Saturday (April 14) at the annual Pancake Breakfast and Silent Auction on the church campus. Breakfast will be served from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m.

The event, now in its 13th year, is a tradition at Ascension that draws church members, school families and friends from the community for a morning of food and fellowship.

Along with the breakfast, a silent auction and a raffle prizes will be on display in the Parish Hall, featuring over 100 gift baskets and other items to help raise funds for the church.

Huber's Volunteerism Shines in Long-Standing Church and Community Tradition at Ascension



Although it takes the teamwork of dozens of volunteers from the Ascension church, school and Pacific Lutheran High School to make the annual Pancake Breakfast successful each year, it is the leadership of one couple who manage all the details to bring it all together.

Norb and Linda Huber, longtime members of Ascension and both deeply committed volunteers in the ministry at Ascension, have been at the helm of this community tradition for nearly 20 years.

The Pancake Breakfast, which is one of largest events Ascension puts on every year, was started by Norb and Joe Strubbe as a school fundraiser in 1984 as part of what was then the South Bay Lutheran High School and Good Shepherd Lutheran in Inglewood. The event Norb and Linda Huber, who helped start the annual Pancake Breakfast and Silent Auction event 13 years ago, will be leading it for the last time at Ascension this year as they prepare to retire in Northern California in June to be closer to family

moved to Ascension in 2005 and has been a tradition here ever since, providing fellowship for thousands through the years. The popular Silent Auction and raffle drawing portion of the annual event is managed by Norb's wife, Linda, and the Fellowship Board of Ascension.

Norb, who has a heart for evangelism in all that he does in the community, sees this Pancake Breakfast as an outreach ministry. "This is an event that brings people together from our church, schools and community," he said. "There is no fear in inviting people to something like this. Our vision for this event has always been to provide a relaxed and stress-free way for our church to connect people with people in this area."

After this year, however, that vision needs to be carried forward by a new team of leaders, as Norb and his wife, Linda, leave in June to retire in northern California to be close to their family.

What is more important to him is that the church continues to see the value of volunteerism. "There is a sense of motivation in Christians to outwardly express their faith by serving. Jesus was a servant, and we have all been given talents to serve as well."

But God desires that we live in our New Natures, and like I said before, that means serving others.

I am urging our leaders to reach out and call on people in the congregation as they need help for certain events and projects. All I'm asking of you is to be ready to serve when called upon.
